



## INFORMATION

### Trailheads & Camping

Two main trailheads exist for the Bull Mountain Trail System. One is at the base of Bull Mountain and the end of Forest Road #83. The other is more accessible, located at the base of Jake Mountain and just off the paved Nimblewill Road. Each has a large parking lot and overnight camping is permitted. The parking fee is \$2. There are also a few small pullout parking spots located along Forest Roads 28-1, 83, 77, 77A and 28B. These are rarely suitable for more than one car. Please do not block any gates. Primitive camping is available at the end of Forest Road 77A.

### Sharing The Bull Mountain Trails

The trail system has a number of user groups, including horseback riders, hikers, hunters and cyclists. Each group has an equal right to use the trails. Cyclists should yield trail to all other users. Be especially considerate of horseback riders and avoid spooking the horses. Should you meet a horse, get off the trail and off your bike while making verbal contact with the rider. Speak calmly and ask the rider how best to proceed. Not only is this the safest behavior, it's also the most polite.

### The Wildlife Area

All Bull Mountain trails lie within the Blue Ridge Wildlife Management Area. Some trails traverse open fields and cross small streams. These open fields are managed wildlife food
